


() Charging the Internal Battery Mini USB Port Charging with the Mini USB cable Power off the device and connect it 5V/500mA DC to a USB port on your computer with the Mini USB cable. Do not connect through a USB hub. DC Port Note: USB power can only recharge the battery. It is insufficient to power and operate the device. It will take 6 hours to full charge the battery from empty. Charging with the AC adapter 5V/2A DC Connect the device to a wall power socket with the provided AC adapter. You can continue to use the device while it is charging



Slide and hold the power switch until you hear a beep sound.





Powering the Device Off








For Album, insert a memory card and select Backup from the Main Menu to open the Backup menu. Then, select a Backup option.

For Album OTG, the Backup menu will open automatically when you connect a USB device. If it does not, return to the Main Menu and select Backup.

NOTE Press the Exit button at any time to cancel a backup. You may have to press Exit a few times if the system is busy.

Backed Up Files


The contents of each backup are saved in a separate folder named "BACKUP.xxx" in the main directory of the device, where "xxx" is a number that increases sequentially with each backup (e.g. BACKUP.001, BACKUP.002 etc.) With Album, you can specify the backup folder destination.





Rotating and Fit to Screen Images

Press the OK button to rotate an image 90 degrees.



Changing Rotation Direction

- 1. Press the Menu button.
- 2. Select Rotate Direction.
- 3. Select Clockwise or Counterclockwise.

Fitting Images to Screen

- 1. Press the Menu button.
- 2. Select Auto Fit to Screen.
- 3. Select On. The current image will adjust to fit to Screen.

NOTE

You cannot rotate an image unless the Auto Fit to Screen option is turned off.

Adding Favorite and Deleting Images

To navigate full-screen images, press Right on the directional pad to go forward and Left to go back.

09 IMAGES Zooming In/Out and Setting Images as Wallpaper

1. When viewing an image full-screen, press the Zoom-In button to zoom in on the center of the image by 1x. Conversely, press the Zoom-Out button to zoom out by 1x.




Zoom selection box. A red border indicates that the system is decoding image data. A green border indicates that decoding is complete.




Press the Menu button and select Set as Wallpaper.





4. Recovered images are saved in the Recover folder on main menu.



1. Connect your Album/Album OTG to a computer via the Mini USB cord.

2. A dialog box appears. Select Yes.



3. The HyperDrive appears as a removable drive icon in My Computer (Windows) or on the desktop (Mac OS).

NOTE

- Safely disconnect your device from your computer before removing the USB cable, either by dragging the removable drive icon to the Trash in the dock (Mac OS) or double-clicking the Safely Remove Hardware icon in the taskbar (Windows).
- If you plan to leave your device connected to your computer for a long period of time, connect the AC adapter simultaneously.

Image Preview Options

From Hard Drive: Preview backed up images. From Memory Card: Preview images prior to backup.

Verification Options

Real-Time Verification: Verify data with a CRC (cyclic redundancy check) tool during each backup. Does not affect copying speed.

Drive Verification: Compare backed up data CRC with hard drive to prevent data error/loss due to hard drive bad sectors.

Card Verification: Compare backed up data CRC with memory card to prevent memory card data corruption Both: Perform both hard drive and memory card data verification.


1. Select Settings > Hard Drive Information from the Main Menu.



S. M. A. R. T

Self-Monitoring, Analysis and Reporting Technology, a hard drive monitoring system to detect and report on various indicators of reliability, in hope of anticipating failures.

2. The LCD screen will display the following hard drive information.



NOTE

Check S. M. A. R. T. frequently to detect hard drive failures early and take measures to prevent data loss.

1. Download the latest firmware updates from hyperdrive.com. 2. Unzip the firmware files (.SEF suffix) onto your device (anywhere) via USB (see p.24).

3. Select Settings > Software Information from the Main Menu.



4. You will see the current firmware version and revision date. Select Upgrade.





5. Find and select the firmware file you uploaded.



6. The firmware begins updating.



When the update is complete, press any button to restart the device.



NOTE

- After updating firmware, you can delete the firmware file.
- Connect the AC charger to your device while updating firmware to prevent any power interruptions.

Formatting the Hard Drive

1. Select Settings > Format Hard Drive from the Main Menu.



4. Reply Yes to the second warning.



5. Formatting begins.



6. When formatting is complete, select OK.

3. Reply Yes to the first warning.





- Formatting deletes everything on the hard drive. Back up any data you wish to keep before formatting.
- Connect the AC charger to your device while formatting to prevent any hard drive failure due to power interruptions.

Muting System Sounds



From the Main Menu, select Settings > Sound > Off.

Adjusting Time Before Automatic Shutdown



After a period of idle time, the device will shut down automatically. To adjust the period of time before this happens, select Settings > Automatic Shutdown from the Main Menu.

Resetting System Settings

1. Select Settings > Reset from the Main Menu. 2. Select Yes. A dialog box opens.





NOTE

Resetting system settings will not delete any saved images or data.
